

- The minimum attendance required to qualify for the board exam is 75%. Any student absent for more than the prescribed days without valid reason will not be permitted to appear for the exam.
- Students must appear for the tests, examinations and preliminary examination before writing the Board Examination. <u>The school will not recommend any</u> student to appear for Board Examination unless he/she fulfills the school's academic requirements.
- Students should cover the entire syllabus and not refer to guide books, or limit themselves to selective study. This defeats the very purpose of education.
- The Board Examinations are very important and prestigious, both for the students as well as the school. CREDIT POINT SYSTEM



BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

Students are not allowed to distribute sweets, chocolates or any other individual gifts to their classmates or teachers. However, they may bring a book for the class library or can donate plant/sapling to school. Students can come in casual dress on Birthdays.

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

- 1. Each student should bring Almanac daily to school with his/her photograph and identification information completed and signed by his/her both parent.
- 2. Good manners, habits of obedience and order, neatness and punctuality are required at all times.
- 3. It is compulsory for every student to speak in English in the school campus and also in the school bus.
- 4.No student should damage any school furniture or write anything on the walls or furniture. Concerned student will be required to compensate for the damage.
- 5.Expensive & branded pencil boxes, pens, watches & other valuables are strictly not allowed. Simplicity is the hallmark of Anand Niketan.
- 6. The school is not responsible for goods lost. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles to school. Kindly label all the belongings clearly.
- 7.Mobile phones/I pad/Tablets or any digital gadgets are not allowed in the school. In case students are found carrying a mobile phone, it will be confiscated by the school authorities for a period of one year from the date of confiscation.
- 8. During work hours, order and silence is to be maintained while around the premises. Running, playing or shouting inside the school building is not allowed.
- 9. This being a co-education school, boys are required to have decent behaviour & attitude.
- 10. Students shall always greet teachers, elders & friends in a pleasant tone, whenever they meet them in school or outside. It should be remembered that a school is judged by the conduct of its students.
- 11. Students are not permitted to attend the school in casual dress except on Birthdays.
- 12. Parents and guardians shall not visit their wards or teachers in the classrooms, without permission of the authorities.
- 13. Both the parents should be present for Portfolios held during the year.
- 14. Parents are requested to switch off their mobile phone in school premises.
- 15. The School shall not entertain any application for change of section/ house of any child once allotted in the beginning of the year.
- 16. Activities such as third language, clubs and co-scholastic activities once taken shall not be allowed to be changed during the session.
- 17. Report cards are liable to be withheld for non-payment of fee.
- 18.As a part of our commitment to promote a vegetarian lifestyle and for well-being of all our students, we kindly request that you refrain from including non-vegetarian items, including eggs, in your child's tiffin boxes.
- This small gesture helps us to maintain a harmonious environment and prevents accidental sharing of non-vegetarian food with other students. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter.

Attendance & Leave

- Attendance in school during term time is compulsory. Absence for more than three days after the school reopens
 will call for strict disciplinary action.
- Students must be punctual for class lessons and school activities.
- Absence without valid reason will not be condoned.
- An application in Almanac from parent/guardian should be submitted to the class teacher in case of any kind of absence. Application through school app is also mandatory.
- Medical certificate should be submitted to the class teacher in case of opting medical leave.
- Once a child has come to school, he/she will not be allowed to go on a half day leave. In case of an emergency,
 parents will personally come and pick up their wards. No child will be allowed to go home with an unknown
 person.
- It is compulsory for the students to be present for full day on Periodic Test day. Half day leaves on any assessment
 day will not be granted unless there are serious health concerns for which medical certificate should be submitted.
- A student suffering from contagious disease will not be permitted to attend school. He/She can resume school on submitting a medical certificate/fitness certificate.
- During examinations, medical ground will be considered only in case of serious illness including hospitalization.
- All students have to be present on the opening day of the school after vacations. Absence for more

than five days after vacation without any leave note makes students liable to have his/her name struck off from the attendance roll.

• If a student remains absent from the school without a leave note for more than 10 consecutive days, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls. Re-admission may be allowed on payment of fresh admission fee.

School Application

- The School has its own mobile Application which can be downloaded through Playstore.
- Parents should check the School Application regularly for updates on daily homework, attendance
 of their ward and circulars/notice.

School Lockers

- Lockers are assigned to each student from Grade-III to IX, so that students can keep their things safely. Responsibility for the loss of personal property lies with the student. School will not compensate for any such losses.
- Students who cause damage to their lockers will be charged. Any mechanical problem with the lockers should be reported to the teachers/coordinator.
- Students can bring their personal lock & key for the allotted lockers. However, in that case, it is mandatory to submit one set of keys to the class teacher.

Identification Card (ID)

- ID Cards are issued to all the students. This card when asked must be presented to any school employee. Students are expected to bring the ID card in all school related functions. In case of loss of ID card, it has to be immediately brought in the notice of school authorities.
- In case the ID card is lost, new one will be issued after submitting a written application duly signed by the parent and after paying the applicable new ID card charge.
- Parents/Guardians should carry Parent Escort card to pick the child.

School Infirmary

- If a student becomes ill during the school hours he/she will be taken to the infirmary. In case of
 prolonged stay in the sickroom, due to illness, parents will be called to school to pick up the
 student.
- Students are administered basic first aid for common ailments & minor injuries. In case of any unforeseen emergency, the initial support is provided as per the need & the parents of the concerned child will be informed immediately.

Student Services - Counselling and Guidance

- Our Counselling and Guidance Services stress the individual uniqueness of students and is based on
 the belief that all students should be directed to a level of self-actualization. The scope of the services is
 preventive and proactive in focus and developmental in content and process.
- Developmental Counselling' and 'Crisis Intervention' are the two main components of the services. The Guidance and Counselling Cell anticipates the challenges in the students' lives and assists them in gaining maturity. The underlying focus of the programme is to help students develop the skill, attitude and knowledge base they need for the success of their academic and personal endeavors. Special Education is provided to students who may experience learning difficulties so that their special educational needs, which are within the limits of mild and the moderate zone, are met.

Bonafide Applications

 Applications for Bonafide certificate will be accepted strictly in the format provided in the Almanac. Bonafide certificates will take approximately 7 days for processing.

Library & Browsing Room

- The library is open to all students of the school. Students visiting the library have to observe the following rules:
- Strict silence must be maintained in the library.
- The library has an open access system and the students must help to maintain the order of the books on different
- Students are not allowed to bring their personal books or belongings to the library.
- Only students from Grade 3 onwards will be issued books to take home.
- Only 2 books will be issued for a time period of 15 days.
- An additional book will not be issued, until the previously issued book is returned.
- Books lost and damaged while in possession will have to be replaced by the borrower, failing which parents will be billed the cost of replacement.
- A fine of Rs. 10/- per week will be charged for late return of book.

- Entry to school premises is strictly not permitted after 7:30 a.m. for Grade III-XII and after 8:30 a.m. for Pre-K to
- Students can avail the school transport subject to the availability of seats. The school buses have fixed routes and the parents should consult the school transport-in-charge for necessary details.
- All students using the school transport are expected to be on the same side of the road at the bus stop at least five to seven minutes before the arrival of the bus.
- All students must occupy their seats immediately after boarding the bus.
- No diversions / extensions will be entertained on existing routes.
- Students will be held responsible for any damage to the buses caused by negligence or vandalism. Students will be fined for any damage to the bus.
- No student will be allowed to travel standing on the foot board.
- In case of a change in address or phone number, the school office along with the transport-in-charge should be informed a month in advance.
- In case of change in the bus stop or bus route an application should be submitted on the application form available in the administrative office. It should be duly filled, completed and submitted in the office along with an administrative charge of Rs. 100/-.
- Wearing helmet is mandatory for the parent/guardian who personally drop their wards to school on two wheelers.
- It is the responsibility of the parents to pick up their ward from the allotted bus stop, failing which the child will be handed over only at the last stop of the bus route.
- Children will be handed only to the persons carrying the Parent Card.
- As and when fuel price increases, transport fare may change.
- Students using the school transport must maintain proper discipline or else the transport facility would be withdrawn with immediate effect.
- The consumption of edibles and drinks is not permitted in the school transport.
- Respect for the bus and its staff will be highly appreciated.
- In case of any problem or any mishap, the parents are advised to avoid any altercation with drivers and conductors. They should immediately contact the school authorities on the phone number given on the bus, or the phone number given in the Almanac. The school will ensure appropriate action in such circumstances. For any information whatsoever, parents are expected not to rely on any information that they may get from drivers and conductors. For information related to their wards and academic process, timing or working days, they should contact the school directly.
- Parents are requested to study the specified routes and opt for those which suit them the best. Please remember that it is not possible to cater to individual requirements at the cost of time and distance.
- Students are not allowed to travel in any other bus route except their own route.

 The bus drivers are authorized to stop the bus only at the designated stops. The bus will not wait for latecomers.
- The use of bus facility can be discontinued after submitting an application to the Administrative Officer 15 Days
- Acceptance of Request for Change in Transport is based on Route and availability of Seats.
- Any change in transport will be effective from the subsequent month of submission of request.
- Parents who make independent transport arrangements for their ward by hiring private vehicles will be fully responsible for the same. Parents should ensure that proper verification of drivers is done and all safety measures are taken to avoid any unwanted incident. Also to note all required documents are submitted to school authority as per SOP.

School Fee Payment

The Tuition fees will be paid in two instalments:

- A penalty of Rs. 500/-will be levied in case a cheque issued for fees is dishonoured by the bank. The amount
 collected would be utilized either for children's class library or donated to an NGO for underprivileged children.
- A penalty of Rs. 75/- per day will be charged for late payment of fee.
- Fees once paid will not be refunded, irrespective of whether the child has attended school or not. Only caution money is refundable.
- In case of admission / withdrawal during mid-term, the tuition fees and transport charges for that particular quarter will be charged / not to be refunded.
- Caution money will be refunded only after all school dues have been cleared.
- In case, caution money is not claimed within 1 year of leaving the school, parents will not be eligible for a refund.
- Any doubts, queries or requests shall be attended to only if they are communicated through Almanac.

Admission and Withdrawal

- Admission to this school is restricted by certain government & council regulations and by conditions of age, ability
 and conduct. Applicants for admission will be examined and put in the Grade for which they are found eligible.
- No admission is complete until the Transfer Certificate from the last recognized school attended is produced, countersigned by the District Education Officer of the State, if the pupil comes from another State. For a fresh admission a Birth Certificate is required.
- Transfer certificate will be issued on the following basis:
 - Application for withdrawal has been made by the parent/guardian
 - After all dues have been paid.
 - Fees is due as long as no notice of withdrawal is given
 - Library books returned
 - -Transfer Certificate will take approximately 15 days for processing
- Students can be asked to leave the school on dissatisfactory performance on the following grounds:
 - Disciplinary
 - Unsatisfactory progress in work
 - Attendance below 75%
- A student who fails twice in a particular grade will not be permitted to continue his/her studies in the school.
- Anand Niketan Maninagar is established and managed by Utthan Sewa Trust a non-profit organization.
 Applications from people of all walks of life are accepted.
- Admission procedure is conducted by the Director and no other person in the school or outside has any hand in the selection of candidates for admission. It is entirely within the competence of the Director to entertain or reject an application for Admission without assigning any reason whatsoever.
- Recommendations are not welcome and can be detrimental to Admission. Similarly, any attempt at seeking
 Admission through dubious means, even if discovered subsequently, will result in the cancellation of the
 Admission.
- Photo copies of the following are required at the time of admission
 - 1. Originals of the birth certificate 2. Child's immunization record. 3. Applicant's copy of fee slip.
 - 4. Proof of income. 5. Proof of residential address.

<u>Note:</u> Completing the application form does not guarantee admission. Addition of new rules and upgradation of policies would be done as per the norms and parents would be notified accordingly.

STATEMENT OF BULLYING


Every person should be treated with respect. Nobody should be bullied. Bullying can be:


- Emotional-being unfriendly, excluding, tormenting (e.g. hiding books, threatening gestures).
- Physical-pushing, kicking, hitting, punching or any use of violence.
- Racist-racial taunts, graffiti, gestures.
- Sexual-unwanted physical contact or sexually abusive comments.
- Homophobic-because of, or focusing on the issue of sexuality.
- Verbal-name-calling, sarcasm, spreading rumors, teasing.
- Cyber-All areas of internet, such as email and internet chat room misuse, mobile threats by text messaging and calls, misuse of associated technology, i.e. camera and video facilities.
- In case a student is caught bullying, he/she will be issued a Discipline Card.
- Issuing of three discipline cards will lead to the suspension of student.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF BEING BULLIED:

A child may indicate by signs or behavior that he or she is being bullied. Adults, teachers and parents, should be aware of these possible signs and that they should investigate if a child:

- Is unwilling to go to school (school phobic).
- Begs to be driven to school.
- Doesn't want to go to the school/public bus.
- Is frightened of walking to or from school.
- Changes his/her usual routine & plays truant.
- Becomes withdrawn, anxious or lacking in confidence.
- Starts stammering.
- Attempts or threatens of self-harm or runs away.
- Suffers from nightmares and feels ill in the morning.
- All of a sudden performs poor in school.
- Returns home with unorganized uniform & books.
- Possessions which are damaged or "go missing".
- Asks for money or starts stealing money (to pay bully).
- Remains "distracted" and has unexplained cuts or bruises.
- Comes home starving (money/lunch has been stolen).
- Becomes aggressive, disruptive or unreasonable.
- Is bullying other children or siblings.
- Stops eating.
- Is frightened to say what's wrong. Gives improbable excuses for any of the above.
- Is afraid to use the internet or mobile phone and nervous when a cyber-message is received.

CYBER BULLYING

Cyber bullying is one of the common cyber threats being faced by children and young people. Though cyber bullying can impact anyone yet due to limited understanding about cyber threats, children become easy victims of cyber bullying.

Cyber bullying means using internet or mobile technology to intentionally harass or bully someone by sending rude, mean or hurtful messages, comments and images/videos.

A cyber bully can use text messages, emails, social media platforms, web pages, chat rooms, etc. to bully others.

Let's discuss how can you protect yourself from becoming a victim of cyber bullying.

- BOLLYING
- Don't accept friend requests from unknown people on social media platforms.
- Don't share your personal information like date of birth, address, and phone number on social media or other online platforms.
- Remember what you post online remains there, so it is important to be careful and not to share your phone number and other personal details in comments or posts on social media platforms.
- Never install unwanted software and Apps like dating App, online games, etc. from unknown sources. You should be very careful while chatting in the chat rooms. Never share personal details in the chat room and limit your identity.
- If you feel hurt after reading a post from a friend or a stranger, don't react with aggressive reply. If you are repeatedly getting such messages/posts, please inform your parents or elders immediately so that they can support you.
- Also, please remember that as a good netizen you should never share mean comments or hurtful messages or embarrassing pictures/videos online.

What can you do if you are a victim of cyber bullying?

If you feel that you are a victim of cyber bullying, please inform your elders so that they can intervene and support you.

Following suggestions can be helpful in managing the situations.

- Inform your parents/elders immediately.
- Block the Bully.

Save posts/messages that were used against you. Such messages/posts can be used as evidence, if in case a legal action has to be taken.

CYBER BULLYING

Tips for being safe online:

- <u>Practice safe Browsing:</u> One careless click could expose personal data or infect your device with malware.
- <u>Make Sure Your Internet Connection is Secure:</u> When you go online in a public place, by using a public Wi-Fi connection, you have no direct control over its security. Make sure your device is secure, wait for a better time (i.e., until you're able to connect to a secure Wi-Fi network) before providing information like your bank account number.
- <u>Be Careful What You Download:</u> A top goal of cyber criminals is to trick you into downloading malware-programs or apps that carry malware or try to steal information.
- <u>Choose Strong Passwords:</u> A strong password is one that is unique and complex at least 15 characters long, mixing letters, numbers and special characters.
- Keep Your Antivirus Program Up to Date.
- Be aware of using social media. Many social networks require users to be at least 13 years of age, but some allow children to sign up with parent's permission.
- There are many risks that come with social accounts, but stalking and bullying are real dangerous that can haunt kids online and offline. Publicly broadcasting your location is not the safest thing to do. To deter stalkers, disable location services on your phone and apps.
- Be aware of email scams and suspicious links.
- <u>Know When to Shut off:</u> The Web needn't take up all hours of our free time. Learn when it's healthy to walk away and leave the computer alone.
- Keep Your Privacy Settings on.

Marketers love to know all about you, and so do hackers. Both can learn a lot from your browsing and social media usage. Make sure you have enabled these privacy safeguards, and keep them enabled.

ASSESSMENT POLICY

- There are no formal examinations from Pre K to K-II. Progress reports are skill based and prepared on the basis of continuous observations which take into account classroom performance, interest shown in the subject, project work, presentations and regularity in work.
- From Grade-I & II onwards, evaluation will be carried out taking into consideration internal assessments & weekly tests. From Grade-III onwards, evaluation will take into consideration internal assessment, Periodic Tests, Mid-Term and Final Exams.
- The passing percentage in every subject is 35%.
- Students from Grade III onwards should pass in all subjects to be eligible for promotion to the next grade. For promotion to the next grade, securing minimum 'D grade' in scholastic area is mandatory.
- 75% attendance is compulsory for promotion to the next grade.
- Report cards are liable to be withheld for non-payment of fee.
- Assessment dates, subject enrichment activity and internal assessment dates are informed well in
 advance. Any child who remains absent for the assessment will not be allowed to give the
 examination at a later date.

SUCCESS MANTRA

A) TIPS FOR STUDENTS:

a) How To Learn Efficiently

Today, everybody is a student. The expansion and updating of knowledge makes all of us life-long students.

Here are a few tips for studying more effectively.

- 1. Keep yourself physically fit and let your temperament fly high. Get sufficient sleep as we need about eight hours sleep. Do vigorous exercise daily for an hour or more. Take time daily to do something that you genuinely enjoy such as painting, working with tools, music, poetry etc.
- 2. Have a regular place for studying Fix up a study table for yourself. Use a chair with a straight backrest. Only keep items which are being used for study on the table to avoid unnecessary overcrowding of table top.
- 3. Work out a time-schedule and followit.
- 4. Set up goals for yourselves to drive your efforts. Increase motivation by recalling your goals. Remind yourselves continuously to achieve your short term goals keeping the long term goals at the back of your mind. Your learning will be inefficient if your goals are not clear.

b) How To Organize Your Time For Learning

If you can learn to manage your time, you acquire lifelong managerial skill. There are four key points in time management.

- 1. <u>Right Size of Time Unit:</u> Work psychologists tell us that people get their best work done by working intensively for a reasonable period of time, then resting or changing something else to do. Shoveling sand might mean 15 minutes of work and then a pause. For study 60 minutes seems to be a good unit.
- 2. Right Amount of Time: Recall your goals and abilities, and decide how much time you wish to assign to each activity. As a student, 24 hours of study a week is probably more than enough to achieve your academic goals. Increasing study time to 35 or 40 hours does not guarantee better results. In most cases, the opposite may happen The pay off in studying requires concentration and interest.
- 3. <u>Right Distribution of Time Units:</u> Spread out your subjects strategically. Generally, six single hours on consecutive days are better than six consecutive hours on the same day. Do assigned reading just before the class.
- 4. Right Sequence Order: Subjects like Mathematics must be practiced daily. Miss a point and you tend to lag behind. Study tough demanding subjects when you are at your most alert stage in the day.

B) TIPS FOR PARENTS - Right Parenting

- Involve your children in daily house-hold chores and encourage them to ask questions.
- Encourage your children to take decisions for solving little problems independently and to learn from mistakes.
- This will enable the children to understand that mistakes are a part and parcel of our day to day work.
- Children enjoy different things and we should encourage them to explore these areas.
- All like winning and whenever you play with your children let them win at times so that they experience
 the pleasure and pride in doing well. Inculcate the concept of a fair game!
- Share your good experiences with them and listen to their fairy tale stories and simple illustrations with interest. It creates wonderful bonding.
- Let your children take measured risks. As a parent, one tends to be overprotective. This is to be avoided at times.
- Let your children explain parts of their lessons or probably their simple ways at solutions to family
 issues. This will help them develop sequencing of their thoughts and will also make them understand
 "why" and "why not".
- If your child is enjoying something and having fun playing (and maybe you are not), let him/her be.
 The children need to live their age.
- Your children are unique individuals with their own strengths and limitations. Avoid comparisons and give your child the opportunities for developing their potential to the fullest.

GRAMMAR

Parts of Speech

Noun: Name of a person, place, thing, or animal. Nouns are divided into two main groups: Proper noun and common noun. Proper nouns name a particular person, place, thing, or idea and are always capitalized. Common nouns do not name a specific person, place, animal, thing, or idea and are not capitalized. **Examples:**

ProperCommonProperCommonRashtrapati BhavanbuildingIndiacountryPooja RaiwomanI.G.I. Airportairport

Pronoun: Replaces a noun and its modifiers, or another pronoun. The element replaced is called the antecedent. There are many types of pronouns. The most important are: personal, impersonal, relative, demonstrative, interrogative, reflexive, indefinite.

Verb: Expresses an action or a stage of being. Action verbs show action. Linking verbs link a word towards the end of a sentence with a word at the beginning of that same sentence. Linking verbs are often a form of the verb "be". Verbs also identify the time or action (i.e. past, future and present). Examples:

walk(walked,will walk)	is	run (ran, will run)	am
hit(hit,will hit)	are	jump (jumped, will jump)	was
swim(swam.will swim)	were		

Adjective: Describes a noun or a pronoun. Adjectives answer three questions about nouns and pronoun: which one, what kind, or how many?

Example: The tiger's roar was barely audible. The little tiger's roar was barely audible.

Adverb: Describes verbs, adjectives, and other adverbs. It answers five questions: when, where, how, why and to what extent. Adverbs are often formed by adding "ly" to an adjective.

Example: The man who works hard enjoys life fully.

Conjunction: Connects words. phrases, or clauses together. The most common conjunctions are: For, and, nor, but, or, yet and so.

Preposition: Indicates the relationship of a noun or pronoun to another noun or pronoun in a sentence.

Examples: To, into, across, toward, up, down, at, in, on, under, over, before, after, during, for, against, with.

Interjection: A word or phrase used independently to express strong emotion surprise, or to summon attention. Interjections are followed by an exclamation point, or by a comma when the feeling is not so strong.

Examples: Shoot! I lost my only set of car keys.

Apostrophe

• Use an apostrophe to show ownership or possession.

Example: That elephant's ears are huge.

The kittens' teeth are intimidating.

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• Use an apostrophe to show where letters have been left out of the shortened words.

Example: I'll (sha- or wi- have been omitted).

O'clock (of the clock is shortened).

We're (a- has been omitted).

Braces



 Use the brace to group information together, particularly in note taking.

Example:

Dogs Elephants Cats Pigs

Are all examples of animals.

Asterisk



- Use three asterisks centred on a line to denote the omission of one or more paragraphs from a quotation.
- Use an asterisk in a short paper to refer the reader to more information contained at the bottom of the page.

Brackets

Use brackets around material added to someone else's quote.
 Example: "We [citizens of India] have nothing to fear but fear itself."

Colon



- Use a colon to direct attention to an explanation or summary, a series, or a quotation.
 - **Example:** They brought many items to the party: Cheese, Salad, Bikaneri Papad and Rasmalai.
- Use a colon to introduce a list, at the end of a salutation, or between numbers used to indicate time.

Example: Dear Ms. Robinson:

Slash (Oblique)

Use a slash between terms to indicate that either term is acceptable.
 Example: Sometimes a nap and/or food can put me in a better mood.

USEFUL INFORMATION (ENGLISH)

Comma

- Use a comma if a sentence contains a list of people, things, or ideas.
 Example: People, things, or ideas.
- Use a comma before conjunctions when the sentences joined by the conjunction both have a subject and a verb,

Example: The class went to Manali, but Mohan stayed home.

Use a comma to separate dates.
 Example: I started school on August 1, 2003.

Hyphen

 Use a hyphen to make a compound word Example: My brother has a new five-gear motorcycle.

• Use a hyphen to Join two or more words serving as a single adjective before a noun

Example: Shekhar is a well-known writer.

Dash

 It is longer than the hyphen. It is used to denote more information about a person, things, village, city, etc. and to give the meanings of words.
 Example: Mr. Kapoor – father of Sohan.

Parenthesis



Use of parenthesis to enclose explanatory or supplementary material that interrupts the normal sentence structure,
 Example: I was born in Dehradun (Uttaranchal) on March 20 (the first day of spring) in 1982. I now realise that my family had more pets (2 dogs, 4 cats and 1 parrot) than an average family.

Quotation Marks



Use quotation marks before and after direct quotes.
 Example: I sauntered over to the man in overalls and said, "Hey mister, nice hat!"

Semicolon



- Use a semicolon between main clauses not linked by a co-ordinating conjunction (and, but, for, or, nor, so, yet).
 - **Example:** Listen carefully; the story gets better.
- Use a semicolon to separate a series of items which themselves contain commas.

Example: The departmental store sells clothes, toys, groceries, electronic items; etc. under one roof.

End Punctuation



 Every sentence must have punctuation at the end. There are three marks that can be used at the end of a sentence. a full stop, a question mark, an exclamation mark.

Examples: Wow!"

Identify the given and unknown quantities in the diagram. Make sure to Introduce suitable notation

Step 2 : Generate a plan

Ask yourself the question. "How can I relate the given to the unknown?"

These steps may help:

Look for patterns

Use analogy

Introduce something extra

Take cases

Work backward

Establish subgoals

Step 3: Execute the plan

In carrying out the plan be sure to check that each step makes sense and write out the details.

Step 4 : Check your work

Review your work and check for errors. Try to think of a more efficient solution. Familiarise yourself with the method of solution so that you can develop your 'toolbox'.



INDIAN POLICY

The Parliament

Rajya Sabha: At present the membership of Rajya Sabha is 250. Of these 232 represent states and union territories (elected indirectly, i.e., by elected MLA's) and 12 being specialists in literature, science, art, etc. are nominated by the President of India.

Lok Sabha: It has 545 members elected by the people plus two members to represent the Anglo-Indian community are nominated by the President. The term of the Lok Sabha members is five years.

Functions of the Parliament

- (i) To make laws:
- (ii) To make finances available to the government; and
- (iii) It has the power to impeach the President and to remove judges before the expiry of their terms. In the case of money bills, the bill of the Lok Sabha prevails.

Union Government

The Republic of India is governed in accordance with the Constitution adopted on November 16, 1949, by the Constituent Assembly and brought into force on January 26, 1950.

India is a union of states. It is not a federation though it has some federal features. There are 29 states and 7 union territories. Goa and Arunachal Pradesh became states in 1987.

President

A person who is (i) a citizen of India; (ii) not less than 35 years of age; (iii) qualified for the election as the member of Lok Sabha.

Vice-President

A person who is (i) citizen of India; (ii) not less than 35 years of age; (iii) not holding any office of profit; (iv) qualified to become a member of the Rajya Sabha is eligible. He is elected by an electoral college consisting of elected members of both houses of parliament.

The States

Executive: The state executive is constituted by the Governor, the Council of Ministers and the Chief Minister.

Governor: A person in order to qualify for this office must be above 35 years of age and an Indian citizen. He/She is appointed by the President of India. He/She holds the office for a term of five years and can resign if he or she desires.

Council of Ministers: The Constitution provides for a council of ministers. All of them should be members of the legislature of the state. If a non-member is appointed, he will have to become a member of the house within six months.

Legislature: The Constitution provides for a legislature. The legislature consists of the Governor and one or two houses.
